- American green tree frogs have sticky toe pads on their long toes to help them grip surfaces, like rocks and trees.
- The American green tree frog is arboreal, they spend most of their times on plants and trees, their green color helps them blend into their habitat and stay safe from predators.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Eastern rats nakes are nonvenomous and they have a black back, a light colored belly, and can grow up to seven feet long.
- The Eastern rat snake's black color allows them to absorb the sun's heat to help retain its internal body temperature; their coloring also helps them blend into their habitat (darker environments) and stay safer from predators.

- Northern Cardinals get their red feathers from their food — grains, seeds, wild grapes, dogwood berries, and mulberries.
- The male Northern Cardinal is bright red; their color helps attract mates. However, the female's feathers are browner, helping them to blend into their habitat and keep their chicks safe while nesting.

- The skunk's bold stripe acts as a warning to potential predators that they will release their pungent spray if they try and attack.
